LITERACY LETTER 2: Finding the "Just Right" Book with Your Child

Worried about your children finding just the right book they can read? Use the Five Finger Rule!

Here is how it works:

- 1. Have your children pick out an age appropriate book. Open to the first page and have your child begin to read.
- 2. Have them count the words on their fingers that they don't know and/or can't read on the page.
- 3. If there is only **ONE WORD**, the book is too easy.
- 4. If there are TWO OR THREE WORDS, the book is "just right."
- 5. If there are FOUR OR FIVE WORDS, the book is too hard.

FIRST GRADE should use "controlled-text" books in the beginning, such as:

- My First Bob Books: Beginning Readers: Set 1
- <u>My First Bob Books: Advancing Beginners Readers</u>
- <u>My First Bob Books: Word Families</u>

As children gain confidence, expand their vocabulary and sight word bank, you can move to more difficult books, **BUT** don't forget the five finger rule!
